n November 1, 2024, the day after the ^{23rd} COMESA Summit, the Head of State of

Burundi, His Excellency Evariste Ndayishimiye, received in audience, at NTARE Rushatsi Presidential Palace,



His Excellency Russel Dramini, Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Eswatini. He came to offer his congratulations on the prestigious regional organization whose presidency he has just been entrusted with, and also on the success of the ^{23rd} Summit of Heads of State and Government of COMESA member countries.

The Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Eswatini, His Excellency Russell Dramini, also conveyed a message from His Majesty Mswati III, King of Eswatini, calling for the consolidation of good bilateral relations, friendship and cooperation between the Kingdom of Eswatini and the Republic of Burundi. A wish shared by both countries, as the President of the Republic of Burundi, His Excellency Evariste Ndayishimiye, received this message with enthusiasm and commitment to strengthening this cooperation in various sectors of national life.

During their discussions, the Prime Minister of the Kingdom of Eswatini took the opportunity to appreciate the opportunities offered by Burundi, especially in the agricultural sector, where soil fertility, climatic conditions and rainfall make Burundi one of the few African countries that do not import food.

In view of Burundi's enormous potential, His Excellency Russell Dramini expressed the wish to strengthen cooperation through trade, requesting that Burundi export agricultural products to the Kingdom of Eswatini.

The Burundian Head of State welcomed the wish expressed by the Government of the Kingdom of Eswatini, and promised his host that this cooperation framework would be further strengthened, whether through COME-SA or bilaterally. (**Presidency**)

In his opening speech read before the Presidents of Zambia, Ethiopia, the DRC, Kenya and Madagascar and the various delegations, the President indicated that this summit, which coincides with the celebration of COMESA's ^{30th} anniversary, is an opportunity to assess the achievements made by this organization in moving forward together towards a common future.

Burundi's Number One believes that the agricultural and mining sectors provide and generate income, but remain under-exploited, and called for joint efforts to strengthen food security and stimulate economic growth.

He also called on the 21 COMESA member states to give priority to trade relations, leaving their countries open to strengthen solidarity.

"As part of its commitment to accelerate integration and meet the challenges linked to the free movement of goods and services, from today Burundi will exempt all COMESA member countries from short-stay visa requirements", announced the President of the Republic of Burundi, His Excellency Evariste Ndayishimiye.

The First Lady's participation in the Africa-Asia Conference: a commitment to sustainable social impact



n October 29, 2024, the First Lady of Burundi, H.E. Angeline Ndayishimiye, took part in the ^{11th} edition of the Africa-Asia Conference organized by the Merck Foundation. The event, which celebrated the Merck Foundation's 7th anniversary and twelve years of joint partnership and development programs, provided an opportunity to take stock of initiatives carried out in collaboration with the offices of the First Ladies, aimed at the well-being of African and Asian populations.

In the case of Burundi, this partnership has enabled the Foundation Bonne Action Umugiraneza, chaired by H.E. Angeline Ndayishimiye, to implement innovative programs in key areas such as health, education and the empowerment of women and young people. These actions have generated a significant positive impact in Burundi, empowering many citizens. One major achievement is the opening, in 2023, of Burundi's first in -vitro fertilization center. This infrastructure, the only one of its kind in the country, has already enabled the birth of three babies, offering couples facing fertility difficulties a local alternative, avoiding costly trips abroad. This initiative is fully in line with the Merck Foundation's vision of improving women's health and strengthening reproductive health services on the African continent. In addition, the partnership between the Foundation Bonne Action Umugiraneza and the Merck Foundation

has enabled the training of Burundian doctors in essential medical specialties, reducing the shortage of qualified human resources within the healthcare system. This invaluable support improves access to healthcare for many communities and contributes to the sustainability of public health progress in Burundi.

In the education sector, scholarship and vocational training programs for vulnerable girls have also been established. By offering these young women new prospects, these initiatives strengthen their social and eco-

nomic inclusion, while contributing to a more educated and empowered generation.

The trip also served to consolidate relationships with the other First Ladies present, fostering future exchanges and collaborations for the benefit of sustainable development on both continents. Thanks to these alliances, the Foundation Bonne Action Umugiraneza and the Merck Foundation continue to be committed to concrete, hopeful actions for the well-being and future of the people of Burundi. In her speech to the participants, Hon. Ndadaye called

Bujumbura hosts the 17th COMESA Business Forum



Business Forum since Monday, October 28, 2024, as a prelude to the summit of Heads of State and Government of COMESA member countries. The forum was opened by Burundi's Prime Minister, Lieutenant General of Police Gervais Ndirakobuca.

The ^{17th} Business Forum of the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa brings together political and industrial leaders from the COMESA region to discuss building stronger regional value chains in mining, tourism and climate-resilient agriculture.

According to the President of the COMESA Business Council (CBC), Mr. James Chimwaza, participants will discuss ways of modernizing climate resilience to ensure the sustainability of agricultural production and the optimization of mining, in order to create added value through public-private partnership.

He pointed out that the development of these three sectors - agriculture, minerals and tourism - accompanied by quality control in line with international standards, will help to meet the challenges of climate change and the conflicts in Eastern Europe and the Middle East, which are having an impact on the economies of the COMESA region.

He said that the local cooperative system can meet the challenges of conflicts, by focusing on boosting production through the development of the digital payment system underway in COMESA member countries. On the subject of digital payments, the Chairman of the COMESA Business Council, Mr James Chimwaza welcomed the willingness shown by the central banks of COMESA member countries to organize capacitybuilding and experience-sharing sessions, as well as the tripartite cooperation between the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA), the East African Community (EAC) and the Southern African Development Community (SADC) for the development of small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs).

Burundi's Prime Minister, Lieutenant General of Police Gervais Ndirakobuca, who opened the forum, welcomed the fact that it was being held under the theme: "Accelerating regional integration through the development of regional value chains in the fields of climateresilient agriculture, mining and tourism".

COMESA is a regional economic community comprising 21 member states, with a combined population of over 640 million and a GDP of around US\$1094 billion, according the numbers taken from the COMESA Trade Report 2023. To unlock this potential, Burundi's Prime Minister pointed to the need for deliberate efforts to overcome barriers to trade and investment flows, and foster regional integration. Agriculture remains the mainstay of the COMESA economy, accounting for almost 40% of the region's GDP and employing over 60% of its population.

However, the Food and Agriculture Organization (FAO) Report highlights that agricultural productivity in many of the organization's member countries remains below potential, due to inadequate infrastructure, limited access to technology and regulatory barriers. Mining is another extremely promising sector. COMESA is home to a third of the world's mineral reserves and two-thirds of the world's diamond deposits. Despite this, much of this mineral wealth is exported in the form of raw materials, with little or no added value, he lamented.

According to the African Union's report on the vision for the mining industry in Africa, the value of exported minerals could be multiplied fivefold with proper beneficiation and processing on the continent. As the African Continental Free Trade Area (AfCFTA) and the COMESA/EAC/SADC Tripartite Free Trade Area become fully operational, it is imperative that COMESA member states position themselves to take full advantage of this expansive market.

Ndirakobuca pledged that Burundi would work with all stakeholders to achieve these goals. He acknowledges that the success of these initiatives will depend on the participation of the public and private sectors, as well as the support of international partners. **(RTNB)**

The Minister of the Environment, Agriculture and Livestock answers questions from Senators



n a plenary session at the Senate on October 30, 2024, the Minister of the Environment, Agriculture and Livestock, His Excellency Mr. Prosper Dodiko, was the guest of the day, answering questions from Senators relating to the sector for which he is responsible.

Asked about the progress of the project to intensify the cultivation of sweet sorghum, to extract ethanol, sugar and fodder for livestock, the Minister of the Environment, Agriculture and Livestock said that the donor first requires the promoter of the project and the documents attesting to the granting of a land of 2 thousand hectars before the disbursement of an amount of 153,510,000 U.S. dollars, which represent the cost of the project.

According to the Minister of the Environment, Agriculture and Livestock, the matter will be discussed by the Council of Ministers, and there are two possibilities: either the State will grant the land, or it will recover the project.

Asked by the senators why the State does not place particular emphasis on promoting the cultivation of oil palm and sugar cane to extract ethanol and fuel, as is done in other countries, the Minister replied that the country does not yet have the financial resources to set up modern plants. Nevertheless, he pointed out that the State is in the process of mobilizing foreign investors to invest in this sector.

Senators pointed out that mining sites, rubble extraction sites or quarries are not being restored after these extraction activities, resulting in a significant loss of arable land for farmers. In this regard, he indicated that he would conduct an inventory of unfilled sites and that offenders would be punished in accordance with the law.

In response to the senators' suggestion to involve private sector economic operators in seed research to increase quantity, the minister clarified that research is already open to private sector investors. He added that all land designated for seed production must be reclaimed by the Burundi Institute of Agronomic Sciences (ISABU), particularly the seed centers. The Minister of Environment, Agriculture, and Livestock also stated that his ministry plans to establish a pilot research center for hybrid rice, potatoes, and hybrid maize.

During this session, several recommendations were made to the Minister regarding the release of salaries for the staff of the Coffee Washing Stations Management Company (SOGESTAL), the protection of Lake Tanganyika against pollution, and the preservation of natural forests. They also urged the Minister to rehabilitate the Moso Sugar Company (SOSUMO) so that it could increase its production. **(RTNB)**

Makamba: Celebration of the International Peace Day

he Non-Governmental Organization at the Ministry of Peace and Reconciliation under the Cross organized ceremonies on Thursday, October 31, 2024, in Nyanza-Lac commune, Makamba province, marking the celebration of the International Peace Day, which is celebrated every year on September 21, and the International Day of Mental Health, celebrated every year on October 10.

During his speech, Mr. Jean Pierre Niyonzima, the legal representative of the Non-Governmental Organization at the Ministry of Peace and Reconciliation under the Cross (MIPAREC NGO), stated that good social cohesion and



mutual respect among individuals are the factors that can lead populations towards sustainable development and peace. He indicated that this NGO operates in 60 communes across the country and expressed satisfaction with the good collaboration that exists between the administration and MIPAREC. He also thanked partners who assist them in carrying out their work.

According to Mr. Jean Pierre Niyonzima, during the current year, the NGO MIPAREC, through its justice and peace project, has managed to resolve 253 family conflicts and has helped 20 individuals with mental health issues.

These ceremonies were organized under the central theme: "Prioritize Mental Health in the Work-place." (RTNB)
